

The Royal College of Physicians Medical Training Initiative

The Royal College of Physicians (RCP) Medical Training Initiative enables medical graduates from all over the world to train in the UK for up to 24 months.

How the Initiative works

- The RCP assesses applicants at face-to-face panel interviews
- Successful candidates are matched to suitable NHS training posts
- The RCP facilitates GMC registration and the supporting Tier 5 Medical Training Initiative visa
- Medical graduates can train in a variety of posts at various levels for up to 24 months
- The RCP provides a comprehensive support package for those on the scheme

Eligibility criteria

- Hold a postgraduate medical qualification (e.g. MRCP(UK) Part 1)
- Have been in clinical practice three out of the last five years including the most recent 12 months
- Have achieved the required Academic IELTS score - minimum of 7.5 overall and 7.0 in each category

Posts are usually available in acute medicine, general internal medicine, geriatric medicine (elderly care), respiratory medicine and core medical training. Applications for other specialties are welcome, though posts may not be available immediately.

**Please note, we are unable to interview CPSP trainees during this round.
Interviews for CPSP trainees will be held in conjunction with the CPSP at a later date.**
